

# Cervical Cancer Screenings (CCS) Measurement Year 2022

## Measurement Specifications

Women 21-64 years of age who were screened for cervical cancer using any of the following tests:

- Women 21-64 years of age who had cervical cytology performed between 2020-2022
- Women 30-64 years of age who had cervical high-risk human papillomavirus (hrHPV) testing performed between 2018-2022
- Women 30-64 years of age who had cervical cytology/high-risk human papillomavirus (hrHPV) co-testing between 2018-2022

## Documentation to Close CCS Care Gaps

- Lab report of any of the above referenced tests
- Past GYN/Medical/Surgical history
- Progress/Office visit notes
- Stand-alone problem lists
- Consult reports
- Member reported data IS acceptable when collected by a PCP or specialist who is providing primary care service while taking the patient's history. The reported information must include the date of service AND the result.
  - "Patient states she had a pap last year and it was negative." **ACCEPTABLE**
  - "Patient states she had a pap last year." **NOT ACCEPTABLE**

## Reminders

- Documentation must include member's full name and date of birth
- Documentation must be a part of the member's legal medical record
- Members with history of a hysterectomy with no residual cervix, cervical agenesis or acquired absence of cervix may be excluded. Evidence of such must be documented in the medical record.
